Increasing access to knowledge and enabling lifelong learning

In 2019, DisasterReady has added more than 260 new learning resources to the library, bringing the total to over 1,800. These include self-paced interactive online courses on topics such as Monitoring and Evaluation and Project Management along with new microlearning courses to build the professional skills of aid and development workers. 2019 also saw the launch of DisasterReady's Ready To Go Mobile Guides. Designed for smartphones and tablets, these short, interactive guides are developed in collaboration with experts from across the humanitarian and development sector to support learning on the go on a variety of essential topics.

FOCUS ON: Learning in the Middle East

In 2015 DisasterReady partnered with Mercy Corps and the International Rescue Committee on a targeted learning program for aid workers in and around Syria. Despite the myriad obstacles to delivering training in this region, today more than 19,000 learners have participated in the Investing in Syrian Humanitarian Action program via DisasterReady and have registered for more than 87,000 learning resources. Through sector-specific learning pathways and courses in Arabic and English, local humanitarians, volunteers, and refugee learners are developing the essential skills needed to provide vital assistance across Syria.

Supporting workforce development

In addition to its library of free learning resources, DisasterReady partners with like-minded organizations to offer opportunities to prepare for certifications. These in-depth learning programs enable learners to earn credentials and demonstrate mastery of essential skills required of the humanitarian workforce. In addition to certification opportunities through outside organizations, DisasterReady will soon offer its first certification program in humanitarian procurement and logistics with self-paced courses and an online exam offered in English and Arabic free of charge to enable access by humanitarians anywhere, anytime.









Helping organizations to build staff capacity

Over 20 humanitarian and development organization use DisasterReady as their learning management system (LMS) to deliver targeted online learning to over 90,000 employees and volunteers. These organizations range from local NGOs to multi-national agencies providing services around the world. By working with NGOs to develop an organizational learning strategy centered around DisasterReady, we have been able to significantly expand the use of DisasterReady and enabled our partners to defray the costs of traditional staff development.
